Florida's Six Dispensing Organizations: Approved dispensing organizations are the only businesses allowed to grow or sell cannabis in Florida. Dispensing organizations must receive (1) cultivation authorization, (2) processing authorization *and* (3) dispensing authorization prior to selling medical cannabis products to patients.

Presently, <u>two of the six</u> dispensing organizations have received dispensing authorization and are authorized to dispense statewide.

Aside from patients or their legal representative, dispensing organization employees are the only individuals allowed to transport medical cannabis.

4. *The Green Solution (San Felasco Nurseries) (Alachua County)

5. *Knox Medical (Knox Nursery) (Orange County)

6. *Modern Health Concepts (Costa Nursery Farms) (Miami-Dade County)

The Compassionate Use Registry: The Department of Health's <u>secure</u>, <u>electronic registration system</u> for physicians, patients and legal representatives is available. Qualified physicians may log directly into the registry.

Law Enforcement: For access to the registry, please submit a completed Request for Access to the Compassionate Use Registry Form to the Office of Compassionate Use, 4052 Bald Cypress Way, Bin A06, Tallahassee, FL 32399.

Restrictions for Use & Administration: Pursuant to <u>Section 381.986, Florida Statutes</u>, patients are prohibited from smoking low-THC or medical cannabis. Patients cannot use or administer the product on any form of public transportation, in any public place, in their place of employment if restricted by his or her employer, in a state correctional institution, on the grounds of a preschool/primary school/secondary school, on a school bus or in a vehicle, aircraft or motorboat. Medical cannabis cannot be grown legally by any other person or business.
