



## MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTER (MMTC)

### Request for Harvest Failure Certification

An MMTC that intends to acquire marijuana through wholesale transfer due to harvest failure must first obtain certification of the harvest failure from the Department of Health, Office of Medical Marijuana Use (OMMU). To request certification of the harvest failure, the MMTC must submit this form, along with the information listed below, to the OMMU through its licensing portal at <https://fldohommu.my.site.com/mmtc/>. The completed form and all supporting information must be submitted within 30 calendar days of the MMTC's harvest failure.

- A detailed description of the harvest failure that includes:
  - The number of plants that were lost or destroyed;
  - The stage of growth of the plants within the harvest;
  - The cultivation facility affected, including the specific address and areas within the cultivation facility; and
  - The harvest number.
- Documentation showing the cause of the harvest failure including any photo evidence.
- A detailed corrective action plan to prevent future harvest failures resulting from the same or similar harvest failure type.
- Revisions or updates to the standard operating procedures applicable to the harvest failure.
- Seed-to-sale data notifying the OMMU that marijuana plants within the harvest were lost or destroyed.
- Video surveillance and marijuana waste records as required by Rule 64-4.207, F.A.C., reflecting the MMTC's disposal of the marijuana plants within the harvest that were destroyed.

#### *How to Claim a Public Records Exemption*

If the MMTC intends to claim any exemption from public records disclosure under section 119.07, Florida Statutes, or any other exemption from public records disclosure provided by law for any part of its request, it must indicate on the request the specific sections for which it claims an exemption and the statutory basis for the exemption. The requestor shall submit a redacted copy of the request redacting **only** those items identified as exempt concurrent with the submission of the request for approval. Failure to provide a redacted copy of the request at the time of submission, or failure to identify and redact information claimed as trade secret may result in the release of all information in response to a public records request unless the information falls under another public records exemption.
